JACOB (Cont...)

Portion: Gen. 37 to 49

Memory Verse: Psalm 37: 3-5 : - 3. Trust in the Lord, and do good; Dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness. 4. Delight yourself also in the Lord, And He shall give you the desires of your heart. 5. Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass.

Central verse: Jesus arose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great clam. (Math. 8:26).
